CAM Meeting Minutes

CAM Meeting Minutes March 19, 2013

Vic Welland called the meeting to order at 7:05 PM and welcomed all.

The agenda and previous meeting minutes were approved.

New member applications – None.

Treasurer's report – Club balance is \$3,235.21 Checks written; Scouts \$100, AMA \$90, Deposits; \$50 dues.

Safety report — The airfield is an isolated place. Try not to fly alone. If you must, make sure you file a flight plan with someone. Let them know where you're going and when you'll be back. Be sure to close your flight plan when you've returned. It wouldn't be hard to imagine someone breaking a leg retrieving a crash in the woods. Without someone knowing where you are and when you should return it could be a long time before you were discovered. Don't be complacent, be safe.

It was reported that the GPS coordinates on the sign at the airfield are incorrect. Vic offered to check that out and have a corrected sign made.

Field report — Current fix is holding up. We are still waiting for permits from DOT to dump concrete millings. These are expected in April. John to check on availability of used pool liners and covers. It was reported that the porta-John needs to be serviced and a vent cap is needed.

Intro pilot report - None.

Old business –Re the school for the deaf

event; ages are 11 thru high school. There will be 3 agendas: dart for youngest, foam gliders for middle school and design and build an aircraft that will carry 2 lbs for the high schoolers. Demo flights with the largest being 40 size. There will be a secure area for displays. This will be sponsored by the AMA STEM program. The date has not been set.
